

The Wyoming Sample Educator Evaluation System (SEES)

The Wyoming SEES is a locally-developed option for school districts seeking a teacher evaluation system that meets the requirements in Chapter 29, Section 6(a). It was built collaboratively by a statewide committee of teachers, principals, and central office staff over three years and piloted by six Wyoming districts during the 2020/21 school year.

Comprehensive and concise

Uses three standards for teacher practice and an associated rubric with 89 specific indicators

Based on research and best practice; aligned with InTASC Model Core Teaching Standards

Tested with more than 600 educators in six Wyoming districts


Guide individual teacher performance and professional growth
